
Public Comment Period #2 (Summer 2016)

Who we heard from:

- 506 surveys received
- 74% said they live in the Bright 74 Study Area



Summary of Public Comments Shared:

- No new roads should be constructed
- Priority should be given to straightening, improving and repairing existing roads
- Preserve the rural, quiet, small town feel of the Bright Area
- New roads are not worth the financial costs
- Improvements are needed to other roadways not included in the 4 concepts
- Do not want more traffic volumes, speeding, noise
- Concerns regarding negative impact to environmental/natural resources
- Concerns regarding safety for people, children, families, horses and bicyclists
- Concerns regarding proximity of concepts to residential properties and risk to property values
